



PC COACHES POOL LEAGUE

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

- 1. <u>Tied Final Positions</u>. When 1^{st} or 2^{nd} positions in a League are tied, the final position will be determined when one of the following criteria is met:
 - a. Team winning the most number of Matches.
 - b. Team with the best head to head record.
 - c. Team with the highest number of away wins.

This list is not exhaustive, although it should be sufficient. Should it still not produce a result, the criteria will be extended in accordance with World Pool rules.

2. Match Start Time. (Rule 13 refers).

- a. All Matches should start at 8pm prompt.
- b. At least 4 players must be in attendance by 8.15pm. If, by 8.15pm, these conditions have not been met, the non-offending Team may, if they wish, claim the first game.
- c. If, by 8.30pm, the conditions still have not been met, the non-offending Team can claim the Match.
- d. Continuous play must be observed.

3. Rearranged Matches.

- a. When Teams mutually agree to rearrange a fixture, the Match Secretary MUST be informed immediately. If this is not done, and the Match is still unplayed after 2 weeks, a score of 0-0 will be recorded. This will not be altered without Committee approval.
- b. Where the Match Secretary has been contacted, the Match may be played outside the 2-week period, but, unless there are exceptional circumstances (of which the Match Secretary must also be informed), the Match should be played within 4 weeks of the original fixture date.

 Again, if this not done, a score of 0-0 will be recorded, as above.
- c. Whether or not a Match is rearranged is at the sole discretion of the non-offending Team, which can decline and claim the Match. In this case, a fully signed result card must be submitted and points will then be awarded jaw Rule 14a.
- 4. <u>Telephone Numbers</u>. All Team Captains are required to give a contact number (preferably a mobile) in the space provided on the entry form. This number should be different to the pub/club number and is for use by the Match Secretary who may need to make contact with Team Captains.
- 5. <u>Completion of Result Cards</u>. Some Teams have been putting just Christian names or nicknames on the score cards. This is not acceptable, and they will be treated as unregistered players. This means that any winning point would be transferred to the opposition, and the Team subject to a £10 fine for each offence, iaw Rule 15.

6. Submitting Results by Email.

- a. Both League Match and KO results may be submitted by email to results@linclonpool.co.uk.
- b. Match/KO details must be shown on the subject line of the email, and a clear and legible photo of the result card sent as an attachment. If this format is not followed, results may be rejected.
- c. 'Remarks' or comments must be included in the text of the email and not entered on the score card. This includes notification of a 7-ball clearance.
