

SCOTCH DOUBLES ADDITIONAL RULES

SCOTCH DOUBLES IS PLAYED AS PER THE NORMAL GAME AND RULES, YET THE PAIR OF PLAYERS TAKE ALTERNATE SHOTS EACH TIME A BALL IS PLAYED OR POTTED - EVEN AFTER THE BREAK OR WHEN 2 SHOTS ARE GRANTED.

EXAMPLE: IF YOU ARE ON A TEAM WITH SHAFT, AND YOU POT A BALL, YOUR TEAM'S VISIT CONTINUES, BUT SHAFT TAKES THE NEXT SHOT. YOU AND SHAFT CONTINUE TO ROTATE SHOTS UNTIL ONE PLAYER MISSES. AT THIS POINT THE OTHER TEAM'S VISIT BEGINS.

IF PLAYERS DO NOT ALTERNATE WITH PARTNER OR PLAY OUT OF TURN THIS WILL BE A FOUL AND 2 SHOTS TO THE OPPOSING TEAM; WITH NORMAL FOUL RULES APPLYING.

MOST IMPORTANTLY: TALKING OR DISCUSSING BY THE TEAM IN PLAY IS NOT ALLOWED BETWEEN SHOTS (EXCEPT AFTER THE BREAK). TALKING OR DISCUSSING CAN ONLY BE HELD BETWEEN VISITS (WHEN PLAYING SIDE CHANGES) OR WHEN TEAM IS NOT IN PLAY AT THE TABLE.

BREAKS ARE TO ALTERNATE BETWEEN PLAYERS, AND ALTERNATE BETWEEN TEAMS - EG. FRAME 1: TEAM A, PLAYER A. FRAME 2: TEAM B, PLAYER A. FRAME 3: TEAM A, PLAYER B. FRAME 4: TEAM B, PLAYER B. THERE IS NO CHANGE FOR ANY DECIDING FRAME IT JUST GOES IN TURN.
